Tournament Format and Fees

Tournament Schedule

GOLF The 2018 Greater Washington Aviation Open will sell out. To ensure your spot in the 30th annual GWAO, please sign up for the tournament as soon as possible.

The format will be a shotgun start, scramble, limited to a reduced number of 216 golfers. Foursomes will be equally dispersed across the course to speed up play. Tournament hosts will form their own foursomes. Singles will be paired at the discretion of the tournament. It is important that all players register with an accurate handicap or average score to ensure competitive teams and an enjoyable tournament for everyone.

It is the team captain's (host) responsibility to see that every member's handicap is validated and posted on the scoreboard prior to the start of the tournament.

Only hosts will be listed under their corporate name. Corporations are expected to enter the tournament as hosts when playing as foursomes.

\$650 **Single Golfer**, includes Lunch, Victory Reception, and Dinner.

\$2,500.... Host, if payment received by May 1. Host includes sponsorship of one hole or green, four greens fees, prominent listing in the program, signs at the tournament, and appearance on the GWAO website.


Tournament Directions

DIRECTIONS FROM WASHINGTON, DC:

- 1. Cross the 14th Street Bridge and follow the signs for 395 South.
- 2. Stay on 395 South until Exit 7 (Glebe Road). Exit 395 South, stay in the right exit lane and go to the traffic light.
- 3. At the traffic light, make a right turn on to Glebe Road.
- 4. Stay on Glebe Road for about ½ mile and make a right turn on to 17th Road.
- 5. 17th Road quickly splits into 18th Street (right) and 17th Road (left). Bear to the right, which will be 18th Street.
- 6. Stay on 18th Street until you see the entrance to the Army Navy Country Club.

DIRECTIONS FROM THE CAPITAL BELTWAY:

- 1. Take 395 North to Exit 7B (North Glebe Road).
- 2. Stay on Glebe Road for about ½ mile and make a right turn on to 17th Road.
- 3. 17th Road quickly splits into 18th Street (right) and 17th Road (left). Bear to the right, which will be 18th Street and is a residential area.
- 4. Stay on 18th Street as it will become the entrance to Army Navy Country Club.
- 5. The Clubhouse is straight ahead.

Honorary 2018 Co-Chairs



The Honorable Jane F. Garvey

North America Chairman


ane Garvey's distinguished career in top leadership roles in U.S. government and within the broader public and private sectors of transportation and infrastructure is widely recognized and she is a known thought leader in the industry globally.

Currently, Ms. Garvey is the North America Chairman of Meridiam, the largest investor of public partnerships (P3s) in the U.S. with landmark transactions around the world. During her career in public service, Ms. Garvey served as the 14th Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) from August 1997 to August 2002. She was the first FAA administrator to serve a full five-year term and also the first female to lead the agency.

As Administrator of the FAA, Ms. Garvey guided the agency through many safety and modernization milestones. She led the FAA through the extraordinarily formidable events of September 11, 2001 with compassion and assurance of mission. She also pioneered the FAA through Y2K preparation and implementation and is known for her deliberate collaboration and ability to bring all stakeholders together.

Ms. Garvey is recognized for her breadth of experience at all levels of government. She served as Acting Administrator and Deputy Administrator of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). Among her accomplishments at FHWA, she conceived and developed the Innovative Financing Initiative—properly named GARVEE bonds, enabling states to use federal highway funds more effectively.

Throughout her career, Ms. Garvey has received numerous awards of distinction and recognition for her leadership and public service. In 2003, she joined several pioneers in aviation who were honored as the 100 Heroes in Aviation History as part of the First Flight Centennial Celebration in Kitty Hawk, North Carolina. Ms. Garvey has also received the Woman of the Year Award from Women in Transportation and Women in Politics and the L. Welch Pogue Lifetime Achievement Award from the International Aviation Club Board of Governors in Washington. Ms. Garvey serves on several boards including the Bipartisan Policy Center (BPC) and United Airlines Supervisory Board. Ms. Garvey also serves as the Chairman of the U.S. Department of Commerce's Investment Advisory Council (IAC).



Mr. Will Ris

ill Ris has been a fixture in the aviation community since 1975, when he first began working as a young attorney at the Civil Aeronautics Board. He went on to help craft the Airline Deregulation Act of 1978, during his 5 years as a counsel to the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science and Transportation. He spent the next 13 years at Wexler, Walker, working with a wide range of clients, including American Airlines.

In 1996, Will joined American, directing all government affairs activities with Congress, federal agencies, and foreign governments. He also was a member of the American's executive leadership team.

In October 2017, he was appointed by Transportation Secretary Chao to the FAA's Management Advisory Council.

Will served for a decade as Chairman of the Board of the Green Door Behavioral Health Center, a nationally-recognized organization that provided people with mental illness the resources and support to recover, live, and work in their community. He currently is a member of the Executive Committee of the Board for the American Association of People

with Disabilities, the largest membership organization of people with disabilities in the country. He also has served on the Boards of Ford's Theater and the Woolly Mammoth Theater in Washington, D.C.

Will continues to serve on the Board of Directors of the Advanced Navigation & Positioning Corporation in Hood River, Oregon, an aerospace avionics manufacturer. In addition, he serves on the Government Advisory Board of Aireon, Inc., a company that is in the process of deploying a satellite-based system capable of tracking and monitoring aircraft around the globe in real-time.

Born and raised in Denver, Colorado, he received a BA from Northwestern University in 1969, a MA degree from Johns Hopkins University School of Advanced International Studies in 1971, a JD degree from the University of Denver College of Law in 1974, and an LLM degree from Georgetown University College of Law in 1978.

Mr. Ris and his spouse, Nancy Dorn, a former executive at GE, have four children between them.



Airlink, based in Washington, DC, is the aviation industry's disaster response organization. Since its founding by ISTAT in 2010, Airlink has worked with a growing network of airline partners to respond to rapid-onset disasters and other humanitarian crises, delivering 4,000+ relief workers and 3,000,000+

pounds of relief supplies to aid millions of people around the world. Airlink has led the industry's response to historic events around the globe including the 2010 Haiti earthquake, the Ebola epidemic in West Africa in 2014, the 2015 Nepal earthquake, and 2017 hurricanes in the U.S. and the Caribbean.

Utilizing the power of aviation as a force for good, Airlink works with airline partners and industry supporters to deliver logistical expertise and transportation response in the wake of natural disaster and other humanitarian crises. This translates into rapidly and effectively using airlift to support 80 nonprofit organizations providing relief workers and supplies to aid people in communities affected by disaster in having clean water, getting medical attention, securing shelter, and more.

Veterans Airlift Command provides free air transportation to post-9/11 combat wounded and their families for medical and other compassionate purposes through a national network of volunteer aircraft owners and pilots.



Since its inception in 2006, the VAC has recruited over 2,000 aircraft owners and pilots across the country and coordinated flights for some 7,000 passengers over 3.5 million miles with a staff of three.

Our volunteers report that serving these wounded heroes ranks at the top of their flying experiences. Our passengers are simply amazed that this kind of care and personal attention is freely given. This is a mission where love for flying can be combined with individual involvement in a very uplifting charity (we call it "pay back").

They've got heart. They need wings!
